The Board will be composed of a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of eight (8) Directors, as follows:

8.3 Composition of Board

The Board will be composed of a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of eight (8) Directors, as follows:

- (a) no less than two (2) and no more than four (4) Persons, as set by Board Resolution, elected by the Members as Directors in accordance with Part 9;
- (b) the immediate Past President, if any; and
- (c) up to three (3) Persons appointed as Directors by the Board in accordance with Bylaw 8.6.

8.6 Appointment of Directors

The Board may, from time to time by Board Resolution, appoint as a Director up to three (3) qualified Persons who have expertise, skills, or knowledge that is beneficial to the Board or to the Society (as determined by the Board).
